Presidents Message

I am very pleased to present the Neighbourhood Watch NT's (NHWNT) Annual Report for the financial year ending 30 June 2017, which highlights our performance and key achievements.

Neighbourhood Watch NT has experienced another successful year. Our key programs remain a popular and relevant part of the community resulting with the Neighbourhood Watch NT brand remaining well known.

In 2017 the NHWNT Management Committee saw some significant membership changes with key executive members resigning. I was honoured to be appointed as your new president and am pleased to say that I believe we have a Management Committee that is inclusive and committed to the strategic leadership and governance of NHWNT. These changes also presented an opportunity to review our priorities, governance arrangements as well as the structure of our organisation.

In setting our strategic priorities for the next two years we have focused on improving our program delivery and our business policies and processes. Many of these have been reviewed and our business systems are continually improving. The need to negotiate a new funding agreement with the Northern Territory Government and review our Constitution has come out of this work.

In addition to the ongoing delivery of programs that meet the needs of our members and the community we have also been looking at how we can better support our volunteers and implement a revised volunteer program.

Over the next 12 months we will also focus on increasing our reputation and building on our brand awareness, building on our growing membership and attracting new partners.

In January 2017 the Management Committee appointed an Office Manager, Ms Hannah Finbow. Hannah has been integral in our achievements to date and supporting the Committee. The dedication and professionalism of the NHWNT Police Support staff, with support from our Regional Coordinators and volunteers, has led to the successful delivery our programs, including Mark your Territory and Safety House, and participation in the 110 community events that we attended or delivered in 2016-17. Well done team!

I would also like to acknowledge the Northern Territory Government and the NT Police for their financial and in kind support that underpins our Organisation's work in helping to keep our community safe. And of course we would not be the successful organisation that we are without our members and the valuable support of our volunteers.

Neighbourhood Watch NT (NHWNT) is a not for profit community based crime prevention organisation that was first established in the Northern Territory in 1988. It aims to create safe, connected and inclusive Northern Territory communities.

NHWNT works closely with our partners, including Neighbourhood Watch Australasia (NHWA) and the Northern Territory Police, to empower people to take responsibility for their own safety through the provision of education, information and tools.

We are active in the community:

- Encouraging the reporting of crime and suspicious activity



Membership Statistics

Since 2012 our organisation has documented year on year growth.

This continued in 2016/17 with our overall membership increasing by 7.8%. This is outlined in the chart.

The Safety House program also continues to be popular across the NT and despite a highly transient population it remains consistently steady. The Safety House figures displayed in the chart refer to the number of Safety House locations, not the NHWNT members affiliated with that Safety House.




Membership Figures as at 30th June 2017

Breakdown of Members by Age and Location





The above breakdown of age displayed is reflective of the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) 2015 Population data that estimated that the NT population was 244,300 with the median age sitting at 32.2 years. The members by location pie chart is also comparative with the population data with the ABS reporting that 58% of the NT population lives in the Greater Darwin area that forms part of the NHWNT "Northern Region".

Volunteer Statistics

In addition to our members that are actively promoting neighbourhood watch in their communities, 8.5% (78 people) of our total membership are volunteers participating in our events. Throughout the 2016/17 financial year this group of fantastic people contributed 821 hours of their time supporting NHWNT and promoting our programs in the community.


According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, State and Territory Earnings report for May 2017 the average hourly rate for the NT is \$42.50, which means that the contribution from our volunteers would have cost NHWNT in excess of \$34,892 in kind support.

The data above refers to Police Operations. Please note that NHWNT have assisted NT Police on four community engagement operations during the year. The data above demonstrates that we have contributed to those Operations on 18 different occasions.

Financial Overview

For this funding period NHWNT receipted \$128,318 (GST exclusive). In 2016-17 NHWNT's expenditure totaled \$121,971.

Future Plans & Summary

In setting our strategic priorities for the next two years we have focused on improving our program delivery and our business policies and processes. Many of these have been reviewed and our business systems are continually improving. The need to review and update our Constitution has come out of this work.

In addition to on the delivery of programs that meet the needs of our members and the community we have also been looking at how we can better support our volunteers and implement a volunteer program that aligns with National Principles for Volunteering.

The increasing community concern about crime in our neighbourhoods has also increased demand for our programs and campaigns. With on-going support we aim develop new initiatives and improve the delivery of our programs, increase and broaden our membership base to meet this increasing demand.

Over the next 12 months we will continue to focus on our future planning and improving our governance and business policies and processes. We will also focus on increasing our reputation and building on our brand awareness, building on our growing membership and attracting new partners.

We have a number of new projects coming that will assist with not only completing the goals outlined on the NHWNT Strategic Acton Plan, but will contribution to the longevity and relevance of our Organisation in the future.

Our current funding agreement with the Northern Territory Government is due to expire in June 2018. Renegotiating this agreement and securing appropriate future funding and will be a priority and vital for the ongoing delivery and expansion of NHWNT's programs and reach. Importantly this will need to consider our increasing number of members and demand for our initiatives and services. It should also be highlighted that our current funding has remained at a fixed annual flat rate over the life of the current four year agreement.

Again, we would like to acknowledge the valued contribution that the Northern Territory Government and NT Police have made to the success of NHWNT and we look forward to continuing this partnership.
