

Code of Conduct

Introduction

Neighbourhood Watch Northern Territory's vision is 'Safe, connected and inclusive communities.' Based on this vision, Neighbourhood Watch Northern Territory (NHWNT) are committed to providing employees, board members, members and volunteers with the information and resources they require to enable them to act at all times in the best interests of Neighbourhood Watch NT and the community as a whole.

Policy

All NHWNT employees, board members, members, volunteers and partnered organisations are obliged to:

- Do the right thing! – Follow the law and act ethically.
- Treat others with courtesy and respect.
- Respect the interests of NHWNT and place these interests above their own personal interests when representing the organisation.
- Declare conflicts of interests to the organisation when presented.
- Undertake any necessary training to perform their duties.
- Act professional and be responsible, ensuring their actions do not bring the organisation into disrepute.

NHWNT employees, board members, NHWNT members and volunteers who are found to be in breach of the Code of Conduct may, subject to the provisions of the Constitution, be subject to disciplinary action, which may result in the termination of membership and/or employment.
