CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

Well 2020-2021 has been another year full of challenges and uncertainty that we have worked through together. I am continually encouraged by the sense of community demonstrated by Territorians. Our members, board and operational team all embody what it means to be part of a connected and spirited community and I am proud and honoured to work alongside such a resilient and committed Team. My heartfelt thanks go out to all of you for your dedication and commitment to creating a safer, better connected and more inclusive NT.

In 2021, the Board of Management introduced a new strategic plan with a new vision of *safer*, *better* connected and more inclusive Territory communities. We believe this aspirational vision reflects the true purpose of our organisation. The plan also focuses on our role in helping Territorians work towards this vision through two key elements: education and connection.

Being an organisation that is committed to improving community connectivity, we value partnerships with other like-minded organisations. With that in mind, I would like to acknowledge the Northern Territory Police for their ongoing assistance and support. NT Police is Neighbourhood Watch NT's (NHWNT) core funding provider. They also support us through the provision of a full-time Police Constable, an operating venue and a board representative. Superintendent Ian Lea has been the NT Police representative throughout 2021 and we would like to wish him well for his retirement (August 2021). On behalf of our organisation, I would like to express my gratitude to NT Police for their valuable input, their dedication to keeping Territorians safe and their time and commitment to working with NHWNT to achieve this goal.

This year, after several successful collaborations, NHWNT and Victims of Crime NT have formalised a working partnership. This partnership has enabled both organisations to work together to help Territorians feel safer in our community. In addition to sharing office accommodation in Alice Springs, NHWNT and Victims of Crime NT have partnered with Alice Springs Town Council to deliver an exciting community safety initiative throughout 2021-2022.

Our small dedicated team, Hannah, Ash and Veronica, repeatedly rise to the occasion and continually adapted our operations to deliver the best outcomes despite the challenges. Over the past year they delivered two innovative new resources, How safe is my place? and Neighbourhood Watch 4 Kids. This was in addition to continuing to deliver our Seniors Personal Safety Workshops throughout the NT and securing Community Benefit Funding to grow the service delivery of these successful personal safety workshops to the broader community.

Our team, in conjunction with our volunteers, have also been active in the community, having attended 65 community events throughout the year and increasing our membership by 40%.

Upon reflection of the last twelve months, I am extremely proud to be part of this innovative and community focused organisation. I extend my gratitude to all of our members and the wider community for your ongoing support and I look forward to another year of ongoing success and community safety.



OVERVIEW & HIGHLIGHTS

Neighbourhood Watch NT are excited to report on another year of continual growth. During 2020-2021 we had a 40% growth in membership across the NT and delivered on a number of initiatives set out in our 2019-2020 Annual Report.

In 2019-2020 we commenced the development of three major community safety resources and in 2020-2021 we launched these with great success.

In September 2020, we launched *How safe is my place?* an online home security self-assessment in collaboration with Victims of Crime NT and based on a Neighbourhood Watch Victoria initiative. Since its launch, *How safe is my place?* has been completed by 206 individuals across the NT.

In January 2021, Neighbourhood Watch NT launched Neighbourhood Watch 4 Kids (NHW4Kids). NHW4Kids is an e-learning portal which takes parents and caregivers on an interactive learning journey to improve safety knowledge, increase confidence and empower their children to trust their instincts and react appropriately to unsafe situations. NHW4Kids has had 729 individual users since its launch. This project was funded in part by a Towards Zero Road Safety grant.

Following the success of our Seniors' Personal Safety Sessions, launched in 2019-2020, NHWNT continued and expanded upon this program in 2020-2021. Over the last twelve months we have worked in partnership with Victims of Crime NT and Personal Protection Strategies to continue the delivery of our Seniors' Personal Safety Sessions and to create a new program of Community Personal Safety Sessions. In 2020 we secured funding for these sessions through the Community Benefit Fund.

In total we delivered sixteen Personal Safety Sessions across the NT to varying audiences. 250 community members attended sessions to increase their confidence, improve their safety knowledge and learn practical safety strategies. Page 5

Amidst 2020 Covid-19 restrictions, NHWNT launched a *Physical Distancing shouldn't be Socially Isolating* campaign. This campaign encouraged Territorians to stay connected whilst practicing physical distancing. In May 2021, Neighbourhood Watch NT were nationally recognised for this campaign and were awarded a Special Commendation from Relationships Australia through their Communities Connected initiative.

During 2020-2021, NHWNT continued the development of *MyVault*, a mobile application which assists Territorians to store important information about their personal property. The *MyVault* application will launch in early 2022.







PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

PERSONAL SAFETY SESSIONS

The ongoing development and delivery of our Personal Safety Sessions was a highlight for 2020-2021.

In partnership with Victims of Crime NT and Personal Protection Strategies a total of sixteen Personal Safety Sessions were held across Darwin, Palmerston, Katherine, Batchelor and Alice Springs.





The NHWNT membership is extremely diverse and we are proud to report that we have members ranging from 15 years – 89 years from every region across the Northern Territory.





OUR EVENTS

In 2020-2021 Neighbourhood Watch NT attended 65 community events across the Territory.

Continued event restrictions, due to Covid-19, saw our event participation across the NT decrease 36% compared to last financial year.

Event participation in the Northern region decreased 49% and event participation in Katherine decreased 20%. However, we are pleased to report that our event participation in the Barkly region increased from the previous financial year.



OUR FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

During 2020-2021 NHWNT's income was \$260,105 (ex GST). The income included our core funding received from NT Police to the value of \$223,228.

During 2020/2021 NHWNT have received grants from Volunteering SA/NT, Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics (Road Safety), and the community benefit fund. NHWNT's annual expenditure has totalled \$308,885 for this financial year. For a detailed financial breakdown please refer to the 2020/2021 NHWNT Audit.

FUTURE PLANS & SUMMARY

2021-2022 will be another impactful year for project development, launch and promotion. We have a number of initiatives that have been developed in 2020-2021 which will be released in the next twelve months.

MyVault

Neighbourhood Watch NT have developed a mobile application to assist Territorians in storing important information about their personal property. *MyVault* acts as a home asset register and allows users to upload images and populate the manual fields. *MyVault* will make reporting a theft or loss of property straightforward and aims to increase the user's chances of recovering lost or stolen goods.

Personal Safety Sessions

In 2021-2022, Neighbourhood Watch NT will continue to partner with Victims of Crime NT and Personal Protection Stategies to deliver Senior's and Community Personal Safety Sessions across the Northern Territory. These sessions have already helped over 220 community members to be and feel safer - we hope to increase on this number in the following twelve months.

Volunteer Training

In 2020-2021 NHWNT begun development of our new Volunteer Learning Management System. This system will provide an interactive and accessible learning experience for our dedicated team of volunteers and support their ability to help create safer, better connected and more inclusive Territory neighbourhoods. The first module of our Volunteer Training will launch in early 2022.

My Home, My Town - Alice Springs Initiative

Neighbourhood Watch NT have partnered with Victims of Crime NT and Alice Springs Town Council to bring a new community safety initiative to Alice Springs. The My Home, My Town project has been created to help Alice Springs residents to be and feel safer and includes a community safety campaign, free home security assessments with funding for home security improvements and a series of free personal safety sessions. The My Home, My Town initiative will launch in October 2021.

Thank you for your ongoing support and we look forward to another successful year of Neighbourhood Watch in the NT.
